

SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY



2020 QUILT-ALONG

INGREDIENTS

BLOCKS

* (16) 121/2" unfinished blocks

BACKGROUND

* 1½ yards white

ACCENT

- * ¹/₄ yard blue
- * ¹/₄ yard red

BORDER

* ³/₄ yard red

BACKING

* 4½ yards

BINDING

* 5/8 yard

YIELD 72" x 72" quilt



SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: PICNIC

Cutting Instructions

FROM BACKGROUND FABRIC, CUT:

- * (9) 4¹/₂" x WOF strips; subcut into (28) 12¹/₂" strips
- * (2) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips; subcut into (14) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

FROM ACCENT FABRIC 1, CUT:

* (2) 5¹/₂" x WOF strips; subcut (7) 5¹/₂" squares

FROM ACCENT FABRIC 2, CUT:

* (2) 5¹/₂" x WOF strips; subcut (7) 5¹/₂" squares

FROM BORDER FABRIC, CUT:

 * (7) 2½" x WOF strips. Remove selvedges and sew together end-to-end. Press. Subcut (2) 68½" strips for side borders and (2) 72½" strips for top and bottom borders

FROM BINDING FABRIC, CUT:

* (8) 2½" x WOF strips. Create binding as desired.

STEP 1. HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES


Mark a pencil line along the diagonal of the WRONG SIDE of (14) 5½" white squares.

Place 7 white squares right sides together with (7) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " red squares. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the marked line. Cut apart at pencil line. Press. Do not trim

Make 13 red + white Half-Square Triangles (HSTs).

Place remaining 7 white squares right sides together with (7) 5½" blue squares. Sew ¼" away from each side of the marked line. Cut apart at pencil line. Press. Do not trim.

Make 14 blue + white Half-Square Triangles (HSTs).


STEP 2. QUARTER SQUARE TRIANGLES

Draw a diagonal pencil line on the wrong side of EACH red HST unit. Place 1 red HST and 1 blue HST right sides together so the whites triangles are opposite one another and the seams are nested together. Pin in place.

Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the marked line. Cut apart at pencil line. Press. Trim to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.


Make 25 Quarter-Square Triangles (QSTs).

Note: This settiing only uses 25 QSTs. You will have extra HST units.




STEP 3. SASHING

Sew 5 rows of QSTs and 4½" x 12½" sashing strips as shown. Flip each QST so the colors alternate to create a pattern.



Sew 4 rows of blocks with $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strips as shown.






ASSEMBLE THE QUILT


Sew the sashing strip rows and the sashing block rows together.

Attach borders.


Baste, bind and quilt as desired.



SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: GRANDSTAND

Cutting Instructions

FROM BACKGROUND, CUT:

- * (2) 8" x WOF strips; subcut into (8) 8" squares
- * (3) 5½" x WOF strips; subcut into (16) 5½" squares
- * (4) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF strips; trim each to $40\frac{1}{2}$ long
- * (4) 2½" x WOF strips; from each strip cut (1) 24½" and
 (1) 12½" strips for a total of 4 of each size
- * (2) 2¹/₂" x WOF strips; subcut (6) 12¹/₂" strips
- * (1) 2½" x WOF strip; subcut (2) 16½" strips

FROM BLUE FABRIC, CUT:

- * (3) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips; subcut (28) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
- * (8) 2¹/₂" x WOF strips for binding

FROM RED FABRIC, CUT:

- * (2) 8" x WOF strips; subcut (8) 8" squares
- * (1) 2½" strip; subcut (4) 2½" squares


FROM BACKING FABRIC, CUT:

 * (2) 63" x WOF pieces; trim selvedges and sew into a 63" x 80" rectangle

STEP 1. HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES

Mark a pencil line on the diagonal of the WRONG SIDE of each of the 8" white squares. Place right sides together with 8" red square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the marked line. Cut apart at pencil line. Press. Trim to $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Repeat to make 16 Half-Square Triangles (HSTs).






STEP 2. STITCH-N-FLIP

Use the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " white squares to put Stitch-n-Flip corners on the red half of each HST. Use the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " blue squares to add blue corners.

Set four units aside, and add 3½" blue Stitch-n-Flip corners to the white half of the remaining twelve units.




NOTE: If you make these border units first, you can use most of the cut-away triangles in some of your sampler blocks.

SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: GRANDSTAND

STEP 3. MAKE ZIG ZAG ROWS


Lay the squares out in two rows of eight squares each. Notice that the squares without the second blue triangle are at the ends of the rows, and the red stripes form a zigzag across the rows.



STEP 4. INNER BORDER

Sew the $2\frac{16}{2}$ " x $16\frac{16}{2}$ " white strips to the end of (2) $2\frac{16}{2}$ " x $40\frac{16}{2}$ " white strips. Sew these strips to the bottom of the pieced border strips (the side that has three blue triangles.)

Set these border strips aside.



STEP 5. SASHING STRIPS

Sew two sashing strips, each with two $2\frac{12}{2}$ " white strips and one $2\frac{12}{2}$ " x $24\frac{12}{2}$ " white strip, separated by $2\frac{12}{2}$ " red squares.

SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: GRANDSTAND

ASSEMBLE THE QUILT

Sew 2.5" x 12.5" white strips to the end of two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " white strips. These are your side borders.


Lay out sixteen blocks in an arrangement that pleases you, and sew into rows as shown.

The top and bottom rows have 2½" x 12½" white strips placed between blocks 1 and 2, and between blocks 3 and 4. Blocks 2 and 3 are sewn together without a white strip between them.


The center row is a "double row" of blocks, with four blocks sewn together in the center, and pairs of blocks on either side. $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $24\frac{1}{2}$ " white strips separate the pairs and the group of four blocks.

Sew the block rows together, separated by the white and red sashing strips. Then sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " white strips to the right and left sides of the block panel. Finally, sew the border s to the top and bottom of the center piece.





SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: PORCH SWING

Cutting Instructions

FROM BACKGROUND FABRIC, CUT:

- * (3) 12½" x WOF strips; subcut (48) 2¼" x 12½" strips for sashing
- * (2) 20³/₄" x WOF strips; subcut (3) 20³/₄" squares and cut each square on the diagonal twice to yield (10) setting triangles
- * (1) 12¼" x WOF strips; subcut (2) 12¼" squares and cut each square on the diagonal to yield (4) corner triangles

FROM ACCENT FABRIC, CUT:


* (2) 2¼" x WOF strips; subcut (31) 2¼" squares

ASSEMBLE THE QUILT

Arrange blocks, sashing, posts and setting triangles in rows as shown. Sew rows together, keeping in mind that you will assemble the blocks first with the vertical sashing, then attach the horizontal sashing/posts, and lastly add any setting/corner triangles. Setting/corner triangles are oversized to allow for trimming.

Pay careful attention to Row 4 Assembly which is an exception. It has a TOP and BOTTOM sashing and you will need to sew the right setting triangle on prior to adding the TOP horizontal sashing/posts.

Sew Rows 1-6 together to form quilt top. Trim quilt $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the point on outer red post squares as shown.



Measure center of quilt. It should be approximately 77¾" long, however each person will have a slightly different measurement depending on how they trimmed their quilt. Cut left and right borders to size attach.

Repeat with top and bottom borders. Quilt top should measure approximately 66 $\ensuremath{\,^{\prime\prime}\!}$ wide.

Quilt as desired.


Quilt measures approximately $66\frac{1}{2}$ x $85\frac{3}{4}$ long. Bind with (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ strips.


FROM BORDER FABRIC, CUT:

 * (8) 4½" x WOF strips. Sew strips together end-to-end to yield (4) 4½" x 82" borders

FROM BINDING FABRIC, CUT:


* (8) 2¹/₂" x WOF strips. Create binding as desired.



INGREDIENTS

FROM FABRIC A, CUT:

- * (10) 3" squares
- * (4) 4 ¹/₂" squares


FROM FABRICS B, C, D, E AND F CUT: * (2) 3" squares

NOTE: From background yardage you will cut (1) 3" x WOF strip; (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip for the above cuts.

SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: PINWHEEL PARADE

STEP 1. HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES


Draw a line along the diagonal of the WRONG SIDE of each 3" background square. With right sides together, layer one print square and one 3" background square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of marked line. Cut along the marked diagonal line. Press to the print fabric and trim squares to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (20) $\frac{2}{2}$ " HSTs.



STEP 2. PINWHEELS


Using 4 matching HST, assemble pinwheel units as shown. Make (5) pinwheels, one of each print.


Pinwheels measure 41/2" unfinished.




ASSEMBLE THE BLOCK

Join block units as shown. Trim block to 12½" unfinished size.

- * (4) 3" squares
- * (4) 2⁷/₈" squares cut once on the diagonal to make 8 triangles

FROM FABRIC B CUT:

- * (4) 2½" squares
- * (8) 3" squares


FROM FABRIC C CUT:

* (2) 4⁷/₈" squares, cut once on the diagonal to make 4 triangles

FROM FABRIC D CUT:

- * (4) 2¹/₂" squares
- * 4) 3" squares

YIELD 12" finished block



SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: MOONLIGHT

STEP 1. CENTER UNIT

Add the triangles made from the 2% Fabric A squares to adjacent sides of Fabric B square as shown. Press. Add Fabric C triangle. Trim to 4%" square.


Repeat to make 4 of center units.



STEP 2. HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES


Draw a line along the diagonal of the WRONG SIDE of each 3" Fabric A and Fabric D squares. With right sides together, layer one Fabric A and one Fabric C square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of marked line. Cut along the marked diagonal line. Press to the print fabric and trim squares to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Repeat to make (8) Fabric A + B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " HSTs and (8) Fabric B + D $2\frac{1}{2}$ HSTs.







- * (1) 5³/₄" square, cut diagonally twice
- * (8) 2%" squares, cut diagonally once

FROM FABRIC B, CUT:

- * (1) 5³/₄" square, cut diagonally twice
- * (1) 2³/₄" square, cut diagonally twice
- * (6) 2%" squares, cut diagonally once

FROM FABRIC C, CUT:

- * (2) 5%" squares, cut diagonally once
- * (12) 23%" squares, cut diagonally once

FROM FABRIC D, CUT:

YIELD 12" finished block

* (1) 2³/₄" square, cut diagonally twice

SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: HAY BALER

STEP 1. HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES

Using the triangles cut from 2%" squares, make four red/white HSTs, 8 that are red/light blue, and 12 that are white/light blue. (You will have four light blue triangles left over.) Each HST should measure 2" x 2". If not, either your cutting or seam allowance is off. Fix it now to avoid heartache later.

STEP 2. TRIPLE TRIANGLE SQUARES

Sew the red and dark blue triangles cut from 2³/₄" squares together, then add one of the light blue triangles left from Step 1.

Make four TTSs as shown. each should measure 2" x 2". Repeat with the red and white triangles cut from 5%" squares, and the light blue triangles cut from 5%" squares. Make four TTSs. Each should measure 5" x 5".


STEP 3. QUADRANTS

Sew the white/light blue HSTs into four strips of three. Be sure the blue triangles point the right as shown. Sew the small TTSs and the remaining HSTs into four strips of four. Be sure the strips match the illustration.


Sew the HST strips to the light blue sides of the large TTSs as shown. Each of the four quadrants hould be $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

ASSEMBLE THE BLOCK




STEP 1. INNER STAR

Draw a line on the wrong side of each 1¼" red square. Make 4 sets f flying geese using the 1¼" x 2" light blue background rectangles and the 1¼" red squares by sewing on the drawn line. Sew the pieces into 3 rows, then press.




STEP 3. OUTER STAR

Draw a line on the wrong side of each $3\frac{1}{2}$ " dark blue square. Make 4 sets of flying geese using the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " white rectangles and the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " dark blue squares by sewing on the drawn line. Sew the pieces into 3 rows, then press.




STEP 2. MIDDLE STAR

Draw a line on the wrong side of each of the 2" light blue squares. Make 4 sets of flying geese using the 2" x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " dark blue rectangles and the 2" light blue squares, by sewing on the drawn line. Sew the pieces into 3 rows as shown, then press.





STEP 1. STAR POINTS

Using 1 template A1 piece, 1 template A2 piece, and 1 template C piece, make 1 unit as shown.




Repeat these steps to make a total of 4 units.



STEP 2. BLOCK CENTER


Using 2 template D pieces and 2 template C pieces, make 1 half square unit, shown. Sew a D to a C, then sew on a D, then finally sew on a C.

Repeat these steps to make a total of 2 half square units. Join the two units to make the block center.







If using yardage for background fabric, cut (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips of fabric. Cut into (36) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.






STEP 1. MAKE FLYING GEESE

Draw a diagonal line on the back of each $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " background fabric squares. Place a background square right sides together on the right hand side of a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " print rectangle.

Sew along the line and trim ¼" away from the seam. Press out. Repeat on the left hand side, creating a flying geese block.


Make (18) flying geese units. Each flying geese unit measures $2\frac{1}{2}$ x $4\frac{1}{2}$ unfinished.








FROM FABRIC A, CUT:

- * (1) 3½" x 5" rectangle
- * (2) 3½" squares
- * (2) 3" squares
- * (2) 2" x 5" rectangles
- * (8) 2" x 3½" rectangles
- * (6) 2" squares

FROM FABRIC B, CUT:

- * (1) 4" square
- * (20) 2" squares

FROM FABRIC C, CUT:

- * (1) 4" square
- * (2) 3½" squares

FROM FABRIC D, CUT:

- * (1) 5" square
- * (1) 3½" square
- * (1) 2" x 3½" rectangle

YIELD 12" finished block



SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: SUMMER BASKET

STEP 1. MAKE FLOWER STEM

To make the flower stem, mark a diagonal line on the back of a 3" background square and place, right sides together, on one corner of a 3½" light blue square. Stitch on the line, trim ¼" from the line and press open to make an easy corner triangle (ECT). Repeat on the opposite corner.

STEP 2. MAKE BASKET

Use the stem unit to make an Easy Corner Triangle (ECT) on one corner of the 5" Fabric D square, taking care with the placement. Push the seam away from the stem and press

Then join a $2" \times 3\%"$ bright blue piece to a 3%" ackground square and make an ECT with a 2" background square, taking care with the lacement


Assemble the basket by joining the three sections together, as shown right


STEP 3. MAKE FLYING GEESE


The petals are made with flying geese units. To make one unit, make an ECT with a 2" red square at one end of a 2" \times 3¹/₂" background piece. Repeat at the other end. Make 8 flying geese.

STEP 4. MAKE HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES

The sepals are made with half square triangles. Mark a diagonal line on the back of a 4" light blue square, layer with a 4" red square and pin. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the line. Cut the units apart and press the seams open. Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square










STEP 5. FLOWER CENTER


To make the centre of the flower make an ECT on the corner of a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " light blue square with a 2" red square. Press the seam open. Repeat on the three remaining corners




STEP 6. FLOWER ASSEMBLY

Join flying geese, HSTs, and background pieces as shown to make the three flower units.










- * (8) 1½" squares [*Alt method* (1) 1½" x 13" strip]

- * (8) 1½" squares
- * (4) 4¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" rectangles

FROM FABRIC D, CUT:

* (4) 4½" x 1½" rectangles

SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: PICNIC TABLE

STEP 1. MAKE CORNER UNIT

Sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square. Press. Make 8 units (see below for alternate strip piecing method).

Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangles to the side of each unit created above. Press open. Make 8 units that measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Join with units with background squares as shown.


Alt Method with RST, sew the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 13" Fabric A strip to the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 13" Fabric B strips. Press open. Sub cut at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " so that you have (8) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A + B units.



SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: BLUE RIBBON

We will use the Stitch-and-Flip method to put contrasting corners on some pieces. Place a small square on the corner, mark and sew a diagonal seam. Trim away the corner 1/4" from the seam, and flip the new corner open.

STEP 1. UPPER LEFT SECTION

Sew the Dark Blue, Light Blue and White triangles into four Quarter-Square Triangles. One QST will have two dark blue triangles. The other three will have one dark blue and one white triangle.

Each QST must measure $2-1/2" \times 2-1/2"$. You can discard the leftover triangles.

Set one of the white/dark blue QSTs aside. Sew the other three QSTs into a unit with three 2-1/2" white squares. Notice that the QST with the two dark blue triangles is at the bottom right of this unit.

The unit should measure 4-1/2" x 6-1/2".

STEP 2. LOWER LEFT SECTION

Using the Stitch-n-Flip method and the 1-1/2" dark blue squares, put dark blue corners on one of the 2-1/2" white squares. Sewbthis unit to the end of the 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" dark blue rectangle.

Sew the "ribbon" strip you just made to the RIGHT side of the 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" white strip.

The unit should measure 4-1/2" x 6-1/2".


STEP 3. UPPER RIGHT SECTION


Using the Stitch-n-Flip method and the 1-1/2" dark blue squares, put dark blue corners on one of the 2-1/2" white squares. Sewbthis unit to the end of the 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" dark blue rectangle.

Sew the "ribbon" strip you just made to the RIGHT side of the 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" white strip.

The unit should measure 4-1/2" x 6-1/2".


Sew the $1-1/2" \times 4-1/2"$ white and red strips together, then sew a $1-1/2" \times 2-1/2"$ white rectangle to each end of the stripset. Use 1-1/2" white squares to add Stitch-n-Flip triangles to the top corners of the $3-1/2" \times 6-1/2"$ light red rectangle. Sew the two units together. Now sew the star point unit to the left end of the jar unit. This section should measure $5-1/2" \times 8-1/2"$.



PORCH SWING BLANKET SETTING

CUTTING

FROM BACKGROUND (WHITE):

- * (3) 12½" by width of fabric strips. Cut into (48) 2¼" x 12½" rectangles for sashing.
- * (2) 20³/₄" by width of fabric strips. Cut into (3) 20³/₄" squares and cut each square on the diagonal twice to yield (10) setting triangles.
- * (1) 12 ¼" by width of fabric strips. Cut into (2) 12¼" squares and cut each square on the diagonal to yield (4) corner triangles.

Arrange blocks, sashing, posts and setting triangles in rows as shown. Sew rows together, keeping in mind that you will assemble the blocks first with the vertical sashing, then attach the horizontal sashing/posts, and lastly add any setting/corner triangles. Setting/corner triangles are oversized to allow for trimming.

Pay careful attention to Row 4 Assembly which is an exception. It has a TOP and BOTTOM sashing and you will need to sew the right setting triangle on prior to adding the TOP horizontal sashing/posts.

Sew Rows 1-6 together to form quilt top.

Trim quilt $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the point on outer red post squares as shown.

Measure center of quilt. It should be approximately 77 ³4" long, however each person will have a slightly different measurement depending on how they trimmed their quilt. Cut left and right borders to size attach. Repeat with top and bottom borders. Quilt top should measure approximately 66 ¹/₂" wide.

Quilt as desired.

Quilt measures approximately 66 $\frac{1}{2}''$ x 85 $\frac{3}{4}''$ long. Bind with (8) 2 $\frac{1}{2}''$ strips.



Join rows created in step 2. Pin to match points and align each row.



ASSEMBLE THE BLOCK

Add the final corners pieces as shown. Press well. Trim block to 12½" unfinished size.
